
#### **Celebration of 26th Anniversary of HKSAR Return to Motherland Multi-Cultural Football Tournament 2023**

The DAB established the Ethnic Minorities Services Centre (EMSC) to provide support and consultation services in the areas of education, employment and housing, comprehensive social security assistance, immigration, family and legal disputes, and medical affairs. Last year, EMSC handled over 300 cases. EMSC also distributed newsletters to ethnic minorities through street stations, sharing messages from the Centre and informing them about government's new policies.

Ramadan is the ninth month in the Muslim calendar, and is a month of fasting, worship, service, communal gathering, and spiritual development. During this holy month, Muslims fast from dawn until sunset, meaning they refrain from eating and drinking (including water) during daylight hours. The purpose of the daily fast is to strengthen the connection with God, as well as practising discipline, doing more good, and thinking of those less fortunate. The fast is broken towards the end of each day with a prayer and 'iftar', which is a festive meal beginning with dates.

- The mental health support hotline co-ordinates about 20 related organisations to provide comprehensive mental support services

#### ETHNIC MINORITY WELL-BEING CENTRE

- The service centre located in Jordan will start serving ethnic minorities from December 28
- Supported by a multi-professional team comprising social workers, counsellors and support staff conversant in ethnic minority languages
- The service centre provides emotional support and counselling services to ethnic minorities and refers cases to other service platforms for additional support and/or treatment if needed
